Most States recognize four major types of maltreatment: physical abuse, neglect, sexual abuse, and verbal/emotional abuse. Educational and medical neglect, also fall under the term "abuse".

Common examples of parental abuse include: criticizing, name calling, mockery, defamation, berating statements, invalidation of child's feelings, and even include broken promises. All of which can have long-term detrimental effects on children and the developing brain.

The highest rate of child abuse is in babies less than one year of age, and 25% of victims are younger than age three.

Long-term effects of abuse include: Anxiety, depression, difficulty learning, difficulty paying attention, memory issues, problems with selfcontrol, low self-esteem, and more.

Boost Brainpower

Your child's attention span can be trained to become stronger. Suggest <u>activities</u> that require concentration, such as completing a puzzle or even assisting with preparing dinner. You can also help by taking time to point out some of the small and interesting details in your surroundings, which models awareness for your child. For example, during a walk, you can stop to notice a bird's nest hidden in a tree or an animal track in the dirt, or talk about the shape and feel of the rocks you see at the playground. As your child's concentration increases with practice, their ability to be focused will increase as well.

8 Great Tools to Bring STEM Into Any Classroom

As technology evolves rapidly, many schools wonder how to prepare their students for the jobs of tomorrow. Many skills can be built through STEM, such as creativity, critical thinking, innovation, problem-solving, and teamwork, which will help students to be successful in the future. Fun Fine Motor Activities

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Early Childhood Council Leadership Alliance (ECCLA) Scholarship and Grant Opportunities

High quality early childhood settings begin with well-trained and well-prepared educators. The Early Childhood Council Leadership Alliance (ECCLA) currently offers several state-wide <u>scholarship and grant opportunities</u> for students who would like to earn a degree, certificate, or credential in early childhood education, and for home-based providers who are seeking funding to start up, expand, or maintain consistent operations for their family child care home facility.

ECCLA's <u>Back to Work Scholarship Program</u> provides 1:1 career and college navigation and scholarship awards up to \$2,500.00 that can be used for several different types of expenses - books, supplies, child care, and more!

ECCLA's <u>Concurrent Enrollment Scholarship</u> is for high school students interested in earning college credits and experience in Early Childhood Education.

ECCLA's <u>Early Childhood Coach Credential Scholarship</u> is available to help recipients complete the training requirements to earn a Colorado Coach Credential.

ECCLA's <u>Family Child Care Home Improvement Grant</u> is available to help home-based providers start up, expand, or maintain consistent operations for their family child care home facility.

ECCLA's <u>Rural R.U.N. Scholarship Program</u> provides career counseling and tuition support to early childhood professionals in rural communities seeking to earn early childhood credentials like ERS®, CLASS®, National Director Credential, Coaching Credential, and any of the ECE College Certificates.

ECCLA's <u>T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® Colorado Scholarship Program</u> offers early childhood professionals a pathway to pursue higher education.

Licensing Incentive Bonus Through CDEC

Consider applying for the Licensing Incentive Bonus! This grant provides a one-time bonus incentive to unlicensed providers who become newly licensed as a Family Child Care Home, a Non-Home Child Care Facility, or to become CCCAP qualified exempt. The goal of this incentive is to increase the number of licensed child care providers in the state and to increase families' access to safe, quality child care. Providers who become newly licensed will receive a \$5,000 bonus. Providers who become CCCAP qualified exempt will receive a \$500 bonus. Providers cannot receive both bonuses.

CDEC's partner, Metrix, has sent applications to eligible providers. The deadline to apply is June 30, 2023, and the deadline to spend is September 30, 2023. View flyers in **English** and **Spanish** for more information.


