As they are a non-profit, they have a BOD that donates their time and energy to ensure that all runs well. They also work closely with the School District to provide services to children with special needs, and are part of UPK. Their goal is to provide a developmentally appropriate learning environment for the young children in their community. Family Literacy

We're really supporting literacy this month, and a lot of the special occasions in November surround literacy. Of course, if you know anything about ECCLPS as a whole, we are all about BOOKS! Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, Mother/Father/ Childcare Read programs, Trick or Treat Street, etc. Most of the functions we attend and support reflect our passion for family literacy. Even if one or more of the adults in a household are not fantastic readers, the act of reading to the children in the household helps build literacy skills for all ages. When a parent reads to their child from a very early age, they are improving their reading skills in a comfortable setting, with no judgement from the child. They don't feel rushed to get through it, and even the repetition of reading the same books to kids over and over, is beneficial to both the child and adult. It allows for special bonding time and helps the child to foster a love of reading if they feel loved in the moment. It creates great memories between parent and child - no matter the skill of the reader. Reading books together helps teach empathy, develops the imagination, builds vocabulary and the visual skills to help children begin to recognize letters and then words, and of course, helps prepare them for reading and writing in school. If there's any one thing you do for your child EVERY - SINGLE - DAY, make time to read together! (Remember, these lists are intended to be used as a tool for discovery. To really build a "Reader" let them choose their own books!)

Chocolate milk (or any flavored milk) cannot be served in centers. This includes school based centers participating in the school lunch program. The USDA recommends that flavored milk not be given to children under the age of six years.

Opossum

- Despite its appearance, it is not related to the rat
- It is, in fact, a marsupial and is the only one in North America
- The gestation period is only 11-13 days
- They develop inside the pouch until they are too large to fit, then ride on mom's back
- They can give birth to 7-20 babies, but fewer than half survive
- Average life span is 1 to 2 years
- They are typically about 2 1/2 feet long from nose to tail and weigh 8-13 pounds
- Males are called a Jack, females a Jill and babies are known as Joey's
- Predators include dogs, cats, foxes, coyotes, birds of prey, large snakes, people
- They are known to escape death by "playing possum" or faking death
- They have 50 teeth, a hairless prehensile tail, and opposable thumbs on its hind feet
- They feed on ALL kinds of insects, snails, rats, mice, worms, snakes, carrion, grass, nuts, fruit, and human garbage
- They are excellent tree climbers, but do not hang from their tails
- They are nocturnal and a great benefit to the ecosystem wherever they live
- They are immune to numerous types of snake venom, bees, and scorpions
- They have a low body temperature and are VERY low risk of contracting or spreading rabies
