appreciates your donations any time of year. Each donation made to us qualifies for the childcare tax credit. For every dollar, the donor receives the donation to lower their taxable income, and 50% as a tax credit to offset their taxes owed. You can donate anytime by clicking Here (PayPal) or Here (COGives).

Proposition hh

- Claim to reduce property tax rates
- Allow the state to retain and spend revenues that it would otherwise be required to refund to residents under the Colorado Taxpayer's Bill of Rights (TABOR)
- Create a new, increased cap on state revenue, allowing the state to retain and spend additional revenue each year up to the Prop hh Cap
- Allocate revenue to local governments to make up for decreased property tax revenues
- Create a limit on local government property tax revenue
- Do not confuse Proposition HH with a lowering of your property taxes. This would likely result in smaller increases in property taxes, but not a reduction of property taxes
- In addition to reducing the increase in property taxes, the state would be allowed to keep TABOR refunds for 10 years, with the option of state lawmakers to extend it without voter approval

Proposition ii

- * This issue, also put on the ballot by state lawmakers, would allow the state to keep funding for universal preschool that it underestimated in 2020
- When voters approved Proposition EE in 2020, increasing nicotine and tobacco taxes for universal preschool, the state-issued Blue Book underestimated how much money would be generated in the first year
- * The state is only allowed to keep what was stated in the Blue Book, but it took in \$23.65 million more in tax revenue
- Proposition II would allow the state to keep that excess revenue. If voters say no, the money will be refunded to nicotine and tobacco wholesalers and distributors and the 2020-approved tax on tobacco and nicotine would be reduced

Bats

- There are at least 1,400 bat species across the globe
- There are 18 species of bats known to live in Colorado
- Those that live in Colorado are strictly insectivorous
- By law, bats are a protected species in the U.S.
- Depending on their species, bats either hibernate or migrate during the fall
- Bats are the only mammal capable of true, sustained flight
- Typically, they have a life span of about 20 years, but six species can live up to 30 years
- ₩ Bats are natural pollinators and help spread seeds for fruit, cacao, nuts
- At least 300 fruit species depend on bats for pollination, including: figs, bananas, mangoes, avocados, agave
- Nearly 80 different human medicines are derived from plants that rely on bats for survival
- Many bats exclusively eat insects and can consume thousands every night
- Baby bats are called pups, and survive on breast milk from their mom
- The largest known colony is in Texas, and contains more than 15 million bats
- ₩ Bats can fly up to 100 miles per hour
- ₩ Bats live on every continent except Antarctica
- Bat populations are declining worldwide due to pesticide exposure and habitat destruction
