#### Kid's Guided Meditation for Difficult Emotions: The Storm Calms When We Let Go

This script can help little ones understand that anger is normal. Feeling it is healthy, and not holding onto it is the key.

#### Yellow Garden Spider

Yellow garden spiders are large, orb-weaving arachnids, meaning they spin a circular web. Most spiders have two claws on each foot, but orb weavers have an additional claw to help them spin their complex webs. In females, the top side of the abdomen is black with symmetrical patches of bright yellow. The legs are reddish brown at the base and black toward the tips. Males are less striking in appearance—they are smaller with brownish legs and less yellow coloration on their abdomens.

They are found throughout the continental US, Canada, Mexico, and Central America These spiders produce venom that is harmless to humans, but helps to immobilize prey like flies, bees, and other flying insects that are caught in the web. The web of the garden spider contains a highly visible zigzagging X-shaped pattern called a stabilimentum. The exact function of the stabilimentum is unknown, but its purpose may be to alert birds to the presence of the web so that they don't fly through and destroy it by mistake. The spider may eat and respin its web each night. Only those spiders that are active during the day construct stabilimenta in their webs.

Females are three times as large as males and can live up to a year, while males usually die after mating in the late spring. Throughout the span of a female's life, she can create up to four egg cases, each containing over 1,000 eggs that will hatch in early spring. A female tends to be somewhat local, and often stays in one place throughout much of her lifetime. As winter approaches and temperatures drop, females die.

The garden spider is thought of by many gardeners as a "super helper" because of what they eat. Grasshoppers, damselflies, beetles, and many other garden pests make up the bulk of their diet. The sticky, zig-zag web of garden spiders is the perfect trap for unsuspecting insects. Once stuck in the web, the garden spider wraps the prey item in a thin layer of silk to further secure it. Then, with its fangs, venom is injected into the prey, liquefying the internal organs and killing it.

While that sounds terrifying, the good news is the garden spider's venom does not affect humans. The worst that will happen to you if you pick a garden spider up is a small bite, less painful than a bee sting. Sources 1, 2, 3

SUBJECT: Increase Inclusion in your Child Care Program - Project Include Kits are now available from ECCLPS!

<u>Project Include</u> (en español) offers all licensed child care programs in Colorado the opportunity to build more inclusive learning environments through simple modifications and adaptive equipment.

There is no cost or application to participate in Project Include – all Colorado licensed child care programs are eligible. Simply <u>fill out this interest form</u> (<u>en español</u>) to get started.

Interested programs will start by completing the Introduction to Universal Design training on the Colorado Shines Professional Development Information System (PDIS). After the training is complete, Project Include offers Universal Design and Inclusion Kits for programs to borrow and experiment with adaptive equipment. Each kit contains toys, tools, and materials that can be used to increase inclusion and participation by young children with delays and disabilities. The kits are focused on one of four developmental areas: Communication & Literacy, Behavior & Cognition, Fine & Gross Motor, Vision & Hearing.

We are excited to announce that Project Include's Universal Design and Inclusion Kits are now available to be borrowed directly from ECCLPS. After completion of the Introduction to Universal Design training, we will contact you with instructions for requesting your kit.

In addition, after programs have borrowed and explored at least one Universal Design & Inclusion Kit, they are eligible to receive customized coaching from our team of experts and free tools and materials to keep that will more permanently support inclusion of all children.
