June Bug

*The heavy-bodied June bugs vary from .5 – 1 inch and have shiny wing covers (elytra). They are attracted to artificial light, and you will often find them flying under outdoor lights. They feed on foliage and flowers at night, sometimes causing considerable damage. June bug larvae, called white grubs, are about 1 inch long and live in the soil. They can destroy crops such as corn, small grains, potatoes, and strawberries, as well as lawns and pastures by severing grasses from their roots. *Each female buries between 50 and 200 small pearl-like eggs in the soil. At first, the egg is elliptical, but becomes more spherical as the larvae inside develops. Eggs hatch about 18 days after laying. Most June bugs have a three-year life cycle. Adult beetles emerge during May and June and lay eggs in the soil. Grubs feed during the summer and move deep in the soil to overwinter. Grubs return to the root zone and feed throughout the following summer. June beetle grubs cause most injury during this second season of their life cycle. During spring and early summer of the next year, the grubs complete development, cease feeding, and turn into pupae and adults that remain inactive in the soil. Adult beetles emerge next season. Because of their large size, lawn injury by the beetle grubs can occur from populations of five or fewer grubs per square foot. Adults live less than one year.

*A natural enemy of the June bug is the waved light fly. The female fly, in flight, lays an egg under the beetle's elytra, where it hatches and feeds on the beetle, eventually killing it. A species of bee fly is also a parasite of this genus. The fly larvae feed on the beetle grub in the ground and pupate in the grub cell where they stay over the winter. Wasps are also parasitoids of the grubs. A variety of amphibians, some mammals, such as moles, raccoons and skunks, and birds are known to feed on the grubs. June bug larvae are considered excellent fish bait. Sources 1 2 3




